

Walking Tour of Wabash Walls Murals

We had a wonderful day for a walking tour! Our tour guide, Tetia Lee, was instrumental in organizing this public art display in the Wabash neighborhood. Tetia shared a wealth of information.

Wabash Walls is a public art initiative to rebuild and beautify the Wabash Avenue neighborhood! Brought to you by the Tippecanoe Arts Federation (TAF), Habitat for Humanity, and the City of Lafayette, artists from near and far transformed blank spaces into works of art. This public art installation, a series of murals painted on the sides of buildings both residential and commercial, has breathed new life into this decades-old neighborhood. The project was started back in 2016 and 2017. In 2018, 10 murals were painted in the neighborhood; 2019 saw 11 more added. Artists featured were from all over the world — not just the United States but from as far away as Australia.

It was so interesting to learn how the project evolved, the backgrounds of each artist and how their "signature" was incorporated into their work. She also explained how community involvement ensured the project's success. It certainly increased our appreciation of this art form! After the walk, six of us went to Wolfies for lunch. It was a great chance to get to know each other more.

If you would like to receive emails about future meetings, please contact Amy Paget, pagets@gmail.com. The Group has had several outings and is enjoying the nice weather.




