### Span Plan featured at PWC Spring Luncheon Submitted by Melinda Bain

The Purdue Span Plan program has been supporting nontraditional adult students for five decades and the Purdue Women's Club and members have actively supported the scholarship endowments on an annual basis. Typically, nontraditional students are individuals who delayed college enrollment from high school of two or more years, filed the FAFSA as independent or are 24 years or greater in age, are married and have or are expecting children, and have applied for Span Plan services. These services include two scholarship possibilities—Span Plan Academic Scholarship and Child Care Assistance Scholarship, specialized guidance, and engagement opportunities that develop confidence beyond the classroom.

Keara Wilson, Director of Span Plan, and Mary Kathleen Keller, Span Plan Scholar, spoke at the luncheon. Mary shared her experiences at Purdue and with the Span Plan program with the luncheon attendees. She is a senior at the Purdue Polytechnic Institute who will be graduating with an Electrical Engineering Technology degree in August 2023. She returned to Purdue in Fall 2019 at the age of 29 to pursue a career change. She works at Span Plan as a Student Coach, acting as a peer mentor for other nontraditional students. She is a Span Plan Scholar who receives funds every semester which make it possible for her to continue pursuing her dream of earning her degree.

Ms. Wilson and Ms. Keller were delighted to learn of the Purse Silent Auction. They were amazed at the generosity of the PWC members who thoroughly spring cleaned their closets and donated 234 purses. Additionally, the luncheon attendees were generous in bidding on purses and walking away with the 1 for 3 and 2 for 5 dollar purses that were left when the bidding closed. This auction added \$2,071 to the scholarship donations for Span Plan.

Span Plan donations for the 2022-2023 PWC year totaled \$5,600. Thank you for your continued support of this very important program for nontraditional students returning to Purdue to pursue their dreams.



The Newcomers had two successful outings this Spring; *All Fired Up* in March and *Samara House* in April.




On March 15th, ten newcomers visited All Fired Up on the Levee in West Lafayette.

Kei thanked the PWC Volunteers! who had signed up to help at the






