

Wine Samplers 2

Chairs: Kathy Novak (847) 461-1031 Penny Walters (952) 564-4034

Meetings: 1st Thursday of the month, academic year, 7:00-9:00 p.m. Exceptions for holidays. Participation Fee: Each couple or single brings one bottle of the hostess-selected variety of wine plus an appetizer that complements the wine. Cost per couple runs \$20 to \$25 per month.

The group is composed of both couples and solo members.

Wine Samplers taste and compare a different kind of wine or cider each month. Wines are blind tasted and scored, and then the results are tabulated and revealed. Each member is expected to host once each year. The group has a maximum capacity of around 18 people so all can easily be seated at or near a table in most homes. The hosting member selects the type of wine to be served that month. Hostesses also provide plates, napkins and water. Members bring their own wine glasses to minimize work for the hostess. Members share information about the particular wine they selected, such as ratings by professional tasters, price, country/state of origin, grapes included in production, unique climate or production information about the winery, etc.

Special Needs Families

This is a new group that will be made up of people who have kids with special needs in their lives. This means parents, grandparents, caregivers, etc. The goal is to build a network of people who understand what it's like to have special needs children and share ways that have worked for them. Spam or Scam

This year our president, Gail Fussaro, had sent us a Spam Alert because women in PWC were getting requests to send electronic gift cards to help Veterans in Hospice and Palliative care. Obviously these requests were not from Gail A few years previously there were also similar spam during Joanne Small's administration.

One thing that might be confusing is the language around computer crimes. A spam is the tool that is initially used to get people involved in a scam. It can be sent randomly and unsolicited These are most often on the internet and transmitted through emails. Often they are enticing, and they rely on the ignorance of their victims.

Once a person follows up on a spam, then a scam can begin. If you interact with the trick they have gained your confidence and you are a victim ."A Scam is what happens if you believe a spam and fall for it."

What do they want to scam you out of? They want your identity, credit card numbers, money, email passwords, or access to your social media accounts. The list is really endless.

Prevention is key for us, Here is a number one tip for prevention, Do not ever give personal information or banking details to someone online. In addition, don't open emails that promise something for free. Ignore all messages that have "Congratulations, you have won..." Even if you have an account with a business, don't respond to an email from them. Always call that company back to check on problems or go to the official website. 

Quilters are meeting the fourth Thursday of the month January through October at the Tippecanoe Arts Federation Building. This group enjoys learning new techniques and perfecting skills while forming lasting friendships.

Over the past few months some of the members participated in one or two group projects. The first project we call Quilt-in-a-Box. Our group has done this numerous times over the years. A quilter places a selection of her own fabrics in a box with instructions on the size of quilt blocks she would like and a theme. The boxes are passed to other participants and they make the quilter one or two blocks with her fabrics.

A Round Robin quilt top was the other project. Each participant makes a center block and places her fabric and the center block in a box. The boxes are passed to the other quilters and they add a row to all four sides of the quilt top. Part of the challenge to this project is getting the math right so that each row fits perfectly on each side.


